Sagnik Biswas

Biswas has always been painting, be it on the walls of his room in childhood, or the perspectives during his architecture degree or even the concept sketches he makes for product design, but none have been art for art's sake. It was only after a visit to the Uffizi Gallery in 2012 that Sagnik was truly fascinated by the possibilities of art and began a more sustained effort in watercolor. If travel has been his inspiration, then the internet was the great enabler. He is almost entirely self-taught from the numerous gems scattered on the internet – Joseph Zbukvic, Viktoria Pricshedko, Myoe Win Aung, Vijay Achrekar, and Andy Evansen are a few whose works he has been following closely. John Singer Sargent, Vincent Van Gogh, and Johannes Vermeer remain his major inspirations. His style can be best described as representational – sometimes bordering on impressionism and sometimes borrowing from realistic abstraction. Sagnik's paintings are like visual travelogues telling stories of people, architecture, and places he has been to and been inspired to paint. To him, a painting is as much a personal memoir as it is a visual communicate to his audience. Currently, Sagnik lives in Mumbai, India, with his wife and son. [website](#)



5 STEPS TO PAINTING FIGURES ON LOCATION

EXCERPTED FROM "PUTTING PEOPLE IN YOUR PAINTINGS" BY LAUREL HART

A beach or park at a time of day when there is good light and a lot of people is the best place for painting on location. Most often, I just park my car and capture in my sketchbook people who have no idea they're being scrutinized. Before you begin using a full palette to paint figures from life, practice the following steps. When you've spent some time practicing these, move on to your full palette.



1. Practice gesture drawings

Use a 6B drawing pencil to scribble a series of loose, directional strokes to get down the essence of the action and to capture the gesture and motion of the person.

2. Paint silhouettes in one wash

Without any previous drawing and without lifting your brush, use one color and a small round to get the whole figure in one shot. Figures outside are generally moving, so work fast. Take a good look at a pose, and freeze it in your mind. Painting from life forces you to rely on the visual image imprinted in your mind. Eventually you will store up a mental "bank account" of poses.

3. Divide the body into segments

Separate the body into segments where it hinges naturally: divisions between joints at the upper and lower body, the knee, the elbows and the ankles. The walking or running figure is in a continual state of losing its balance, so limbs are extended as counterbalances to keep it upright. When the arm is forward in the striding figure, the leg on that same side of the body will be back.

4. Add a light pattern for dimension

Once you are comfortable with capturing quick silhouettes, add a light pattern. Pick out one "victim" and stick with that person long enough to create several sketches of him as he moves in and out of various poses.

5. Add more color
